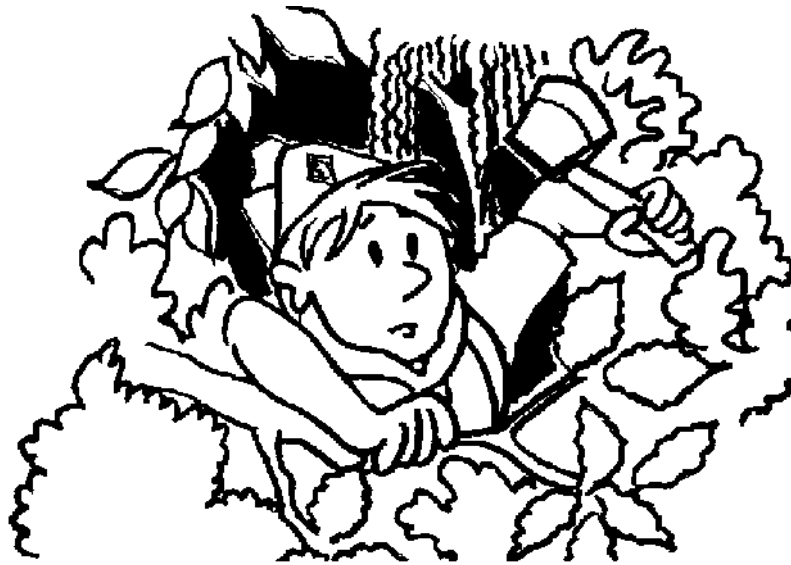


# 2: Travel And Camp On Durable Surfaces

## SPREAD USE AND IMPACTS IN PRISTINE AREAS



### OFF THE TRAIL

- When traveling cross-country, spread out rather than follow the same route. Choose the most durable surfaces available: rock, gravel, dry grasses or snow.
- Do not mark your route with rock cairns, tree scars or ribbons.

### AT CAMP

- Choose a durable, undisturbed site to camp on.
- Avoid camping where impact is just beginning. Allow these places to recover.
- Disperse activities in camp. Separate tents from the cooking area to avoid making new paths. Naturalize the site before you leave so others will not use the same site.
